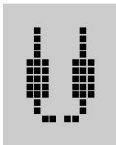
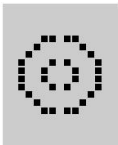
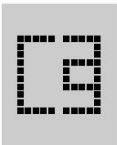
About MD long stereo recording/Playback ()

This unit supports the new MD format. **MDLP**
Audio compression technology called ATRAC 3 enables long-duration recording of double-length (LP2) or quadruple-length (LP4) stereo sound. Settings can be made regardless of the recording source (sound source) or recording method. You can also mix and record songs in different recording modes (standard/LP2/LP4) on a single MD.

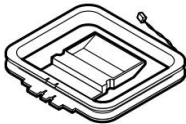

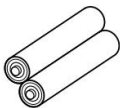

About the power cord

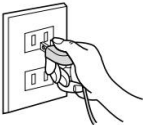
Do not damage the power cord or plug Do not

About memory retention

Insert the power plug into the outlet for at least 3 minutes. power outages or disconnect the power plug from the outlet. Even if you remove the hold.

If the retention period is exceeded, a power failure or unplugging the power plug The contents of the memory will be lost if you remove it from the tray.

If the memory contents are erased, set them again.

If you do not want to erase the memory contents, even when the power is turned off, We recommend that you insert the power plug into the outlet. I recommend.

The accuracy of the clock is about 1 minute per month at room temperature. It is recommended to adjust the time periodically.

If the power failure lasts for about 74 minutes, the entire clock display will flash when the power is restored.

This blinking will be canceled once the power is turned on. Check that the time is correct.

When the clock is set, the demo function will automatically turn off.

However, if the memory for the current time disappears (see below), the demo function will return to "ON".
